
#### WISCONSIN CLIMATE TABLE AWARDED GRANT FROM RE-AMP

The Wisconsin Climate Table has been awarded a State Collaboration Grant from the <u>RE-AMP network</u> in the amount of \$55,000 to fund operations over the next year. This is the full amount we requested! This grant supports the Coordinator, Project Coordinator, leadership stipends, campaigns, and in-person meetings. State Collaboration Grants are competitive. Thanks to the hard work of our members, especially those in leadership roles, our proposal was one of the strongest in the mix.

#### **CEP CAMPAIGN GRANT PROJECTS**

Early this year, the CEP Campaign awarded small grants to fund projects intended to boost statewide engagement around clean energy in Wisconsin. The projects from Green Neighbor Challenge and 350 Wisconsin are described below.



#### **Green Neighbor Challenge: RECSI**

Thanks to the \$9000 grant provided by WCT's Clean Energy Plan grant earlier this year, the Rural Electric Coop Scorecarding Initiative (RECSI) has officially published interactive cooperative scorecards. RECSI is a collaboration between North Dakota Native Vote, Dakota Resource Council, Prairie Rivers Network, Citizens Utility Board IL, and Green Neighbor Challenge. The scorecard currently covers WI, IL, ND, but our aim is to recruit organizations to help score coops across the entire Midwest. #### 350 WISCONSIN: PSC TOOL KIT


350 Wisconsin created a tool kit to reduce barriers to participation at the Wisconsin Public Service Commission (PSC) and facilitate achievement of Wisconsin's climate and clean energy goals. PSC decisions in the coming year will have implications for the state's progress on renewable energy, energy efficiency, curtailing the use of fossil fuels, and ensuring energy affordability for utility customers.

Currently, barriers to participating in PSC regulatory activities are high. Information is difficult to access, understand, and follow, timelines and comment periods are tight, and processes favor utilities and subject matter experts. A broad range of social and environmental justice organizations will find the materials useful and will share them with their constituents, to help dramatically increase public engagement across the state.

#### **ENVIRONMENTAL LAW & POLICY CENTER**

In support of the drive to protect mature and old-growth forests, a **new documentary video** highlights logging in the Chequamegon-Nicolet National Forest of Wisconsin's Northwoods. The Wisconsin portion begins around 17:00 and Wisconsin appears at various points in the video thereafter. This is focused on the Sunfish timber sale, where we documented logging of mature and old growth trees.

### STATE SMART TRANSPORTATION INITIATIVE: WEBINAR



The COVID-19 pandemic and changes in the business environment have led to a decline in intercity bus service in recent years. But with ridership projected to rebound and soon surpass pre-pandemic levels, state DOTs can play a role in expanding intercity bus service, a more environmentally friendly mode of transportation than solo vehicle travel that can provide enhanced mobility and connection between rural and urban areas.

Join us for this webinar with The Chaddick Institute for Metropolitan Development, which produces an annual report on the state of the intercity bus industry, and Colorado DOT, which manages the expanding Bustang system and Mobility Hub program, to learn about opportunities for state DOTs to become more involved in providing intercity and rural mobility in their states.

Our next Executive Director (ED) will have overall strategic and operational responsibility for 1000 Friends of Wisconsin's programs and execution of its mission.


#### 350 WISCONSIN

The public comment period is now open for the We Energies rate case, and we have until October 7th to make our voices heard! We need the PSC to reject We Energies' request, and take it a step further by reducing the amount they can profit from customer rates, and act quickly to implement and improve low-income assistance programs.

Ratepayers throughout We Energies' service territory – especially in Milwaukee – have been struggling with unaffordable energy bills for years. Keviea Guiden, Project Coordinator with the Wisconsin Climate Table and Energy Burden Organizer, has worked tirelessly to advocate for her community and share their energy burden stories.
