WISCONSIN CLIMATE TABLE FALL MEETING

Our **fall meeting** took place at <u>Nature at the</u> <u>Confluence</u> in South Beloit, IL. Illinois?! Yes, that's right, we met in Illinois. (To be fair, you could see Wisconsin out the window.)

Why Beloit? As WCT Coordinator, I am committed to making sure the Climate Table represents the whole state of Wisconsin, so I try to find locations for in-person meetings in different cities that are still easily accessible by our membership. Beloit is one of the most racially and economically diverse cities in Wisconsin, but it is often overlooked because of its small size (the population is approximately 35,000) and proximity to Illinois. Additionally, I felt it was important to bring attention to environmental justice issues in Beloit.

We spent most of the day learning about projects and initiatives by Climate Table members and discussing different strategies for moving forward on climate action in Wisconsin. Most attendees took advantage of sunny, mild weather and made use of the beautiful outdoor facilities at the Center for their small group discussions.

Katelynn Samuelsen from the Wisconsin Office of Sustainability and Clean Energy provided an

update on the state's first Comprehensive Climate Action Plan. Funded by a \$3 million grant, the CCAP will include metrics and goals in a number of sectors and is due to the EPA at the end of 2025. Many Climate Table members are participating in stakeholder meetings and other engagement activities.

One of the day's highlights was the lunchtime speaker panel. Betsy Brewer (emeritus Beloit College, League of Women Voters), Cristina Carvajal (Wisconsin Ecolatinos), Dr. Brittany Keyes (Healthy Climate Wisconsin), and Julie Uram (Executive Director of Nature at the Confluence) shared about their work advocating for clean air and other sustainability initiatives in the Beloit area.

What is the role of the Leadership Team?

The LT supports the Coordinator in running Table operations like planning meetings, keeping track of the budget, communicating with membership, and helping write grants to keep the Table funded.

Who is eligible to be on the Leadership Team?

Any full member organization in good standing! In fact, every full member organization is expected to serve one term.

But I'm so busy. What time commitment is required from Leadership Team members?

We get it. Everyone is busy! The good news is, the LT meets once or twice per month on Zoom as needed for an hour or less at a time. Only on very rare occasions does the Coordinator request any more from the LT.

Will I be compensated for my time?

Yes. We include LT stipends in the operating budget. Each member organization receives \$500 for every 6 months of service.

I'm not sure I know enough about the Climate Table to be in a leadership position.

Actually, that's a good reason to run! One of our current LT members just joined the Climate Table recently, and they've found it to be a great way to get to know other members and understand the work we're doing together.


Can I nominate myself?

STUDENT POETS ARE SOLAR MESSENGERS DRIFTLESS AREA LAND CONSERVANCY

Beyond the customary land conservation work most land trusts limit themselves to, **Driftless Area Land Conservancy (DALC)** continues to directly promote energy efficiency and small scale solar. DALC's Clean Local Energy Alliance – Now! (CLEA-N) project has used a variety of approaches to assist area school districts in exploring ways to lower their energy costs and carbon footprints. The latest initiative was the Shine-On Solar Energy Slam contest. The goal of this poetry contest was to both educate and inspire students and the wider community about the benefits "rooftop" solar can bring to the district. Students in the Dodgeville middle and high schools submitted over one hundred-eighty (180) poems! First, second and third place award winners received cash awards of \$75, \$50 and \$25 respectively. The area newspaper, *The Dodgeville Chronicle*, dedicated a full page to laud the project by publishing the winning poems and photos of their authors. The energy and creativity of the upcoming generations is an inspiration for us all to rededicate ourselves to protecting our precious world.


