GRANT OPPORTUNITIES

THRIVING COMMUNITIES GRANTMAKING PROGRAM



The Great Lakes <u>Thriving Communities Grantmaking Program</u> will distribute \$40 million in grants. This three-year program will serve communities in Indiana, Illinois, Michigan, Minnesota, Ohio, Wisconsin, and 36 federally recognized tribal nations. Nonprofit organizations, local and tribal governments, and institutions of higher education that work in the Great Lakes region are all welcome to apply for funding.

Grants will support projects that focus on issues including, but not limited to:

- Environmental health
- Air, soil, and water quality
- Healthy homes
- Access to healthy food
- Stormwater and green infrastructure
- Emergency preparedness
- Disaster resilience
- Environmental job training

Applications will be accepted through November 2026, and grants will be approved on a rolling basis. The next funding round will end on March 30, 2025.




CALL FOR SUBMISSIONS!
